is my sincere desire that we 'Focus Forward' by working together to raise the profile of our fraternity in this state. Uniformity is key!"


Among distinguished speakers were Great Lakes Regional Director, Bro. David Turner and First International Vice President, Bro. Jean B. Lamothe.

National Day of Service

At the Classics, during the tailgating event, OAS organized a sleeping bag fundraiser to combat the rising homeless problem in the South Suburbs of Chicago. For a considerable portion of the South Suburbs' population, homelessness is a way of life for those living on the cold streets. OAS is doing something about this problem. We took to the parking lot to raise money for cold weather sleeping bags and winter care packages (toiletries, bottled water, hats and gloves) to keep those experiencing homelessness warm through the upcoming winter months. Most of the homeless people are kids that have fallen through the foster care system, the mentally ill, and veterans. "No one likes to see

campsites under bridges, but something has to be done," says Dr. Armston, OAS Chapter President. "We need to have compassion when we see people sleeping under a bridge somewhere; to do nothing is inhumane." Life happens and everyone has a right to be warm. The problem is growing. "Homelessness is going up." With cuts to social service programs, shelters cannot accommodate the demand in Cook County. The need is definitely increasing. To offer some help to the homeless, OAS' goal is to raise \$800. In November, the members of the chapter will fan out across the South Suburbs to hand out the sleeping bags and winter care packages. Any leftover bags will be donated to local nonprofits.

Since 2013, OAS Chapter has committed to this service project twice a year. "The project provides the chapter with visibility to the community in which it serves" says Malcolm McCoy, Past President of OAS. Money Matters

30 Million Americans May Not Be Withholding Enough After the New Tax Law



Updating tax withholding with your employer is simple.

You probably noticed your paycheck got a little bigger this past year. Thanks to the new tax law, many of us got a raise, basically a reduction in tax withholding.

That little extra take-home pay is great — for now. Unfortunately, that larger paycheck might mean you'll be cutting the IRS a check come tax time in April. Due to changes implemented as part of the new tax law, your employer might not be withholding enough of your wages from each paycheck. If, indeed, you're being under-withheld, you'll be on the hook to pay the difference at tax time next year.

According to a <u>new report</u> from the Government Accountability Office, some 30 million people – 21 percent of all U.S. taxpayers – are in the same boat. According to the GAO's report, the hypothetical taxpayer who will be paying in April is married with two children, earns \$180,000 annually, \$20,000 of which comes from non-wage income and itemizes deductions. If that's you (or close to you), you might want to save a check for the IRS, or

better yet, change your withholding now. If your taxes are simple, you may still get a refund.

The IRS encourages taxpayers to review their paychecks and their tax withholding anytime there are changes to tax law. You'll also want to update it when you have a big life change like getting married, changing jobs or having a baby.

Having the right amount withheld ensures your money stays in the hands of its best manager: you. If your employer withholds too much money, you'll get a refund but you're basically giving Uncle Sam an interest free loan for a year — you could probably put that money to better use in the meantime. If your employer doesn't withhold enough, you'll get a bigger paycheck, but you'll owe money at tax time. Getting your withholding just right ensures you're giving Uncle Sam exactly what he needs from each check.

To update your withholding, you simply submit a new Form W-4 to your employer before Dec. 1. And if you're unsure whether the tax law changes will affect you, the IRS created a <u>withholding calculator</u> so you can figure out what you'll owe.
