"In these families, the lack of money, even for basic necessities, can cause anxiety and depression" says Dr. Milton Armston, Jr. Omicron Alpha Sigma Chapter's members are very excited and enjoy helping the families they provide assistance to. "There is nothing like seeing the joy on the faces of the families we help" a sentiment shared by the members who were present on Saturday. The names of the families are given by Little Hearts Learning Academy, Inc. a childcare agency in Homewood.

Omicron Alpha Sigma Chapter has been helping families who experience financial hardships and this past August the Chapter held an event, "Christmas in August" to raise money for families in the community. Little Hearts Learning Academy supported the event. On December 9, the Chapter presented gift cards for toys and clothes, food vouchers and checks for rent assistance to three families in the south suburbs.

Omicron Alpha Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Inc. is a Greek Letter service organization whose motto is "Culture For Service and Service For Humanity." The chapter gives back to the community to which it belongs not only at Christmas but throughout the year.

Omicron Alpha Sigma Chapter Bags Highway Trash Pollution

The members of Omicron Alpha Sigma (OAS) Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. took to the streets this past weekend, Saturday, December 2 to clean up trash and debris along their 2 mile stretch of Highway on Cicero Avenue from Lincoln Highway to Vollmer Road in Matteson, Illinois. The Illinois Adopt-A-Highway (AAH) program began in 1995 through the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). The Adopt-A-Highway program brings citizen volunteers into partnerships with IDOT to pick up trash and keep the community's roadsides clean. The program also educates and encourages people to stop littering. Since 2013, Omicron Alpha Sigma Chapter has committed to this service project twice a year. During the roadside cleanup, OAS collected and filled over 25 bags of trash. "The project provides the chapter with visibility to the community in which it serves" says Malcolm McCoy, Chapter President. Additionally, the cleanup initiative allows the membership an opportunity to fellowship among themselves and with people in the community who recognize their efforts to control pollution. Forging A New Partnership at Crete Monee High School and Sigma Beta Club

Our next step is to work with the Administrative team of Crete Monee to coordinate a Meet and Greet with the Brothers of OAS and the male students of the high school in February.
